
#### Interested in making a difference? Shelter Care always has a need for your support.

Right now, our biggest need is funding to upgrade one of our Respite Homes, located on Nokomis Drive in Akron. This home, built in 1967, is in need of some major repairs in order to be functional for a house-parent couple, and youth, who are in need of scheduled breaks away from their homes due to severe family conflict. It still has its original wallpaper, carpeting, toilets, showers, sinks, tile, water softener tank and plumbing, as well as a roof and chimney, all of which are breaking down and causing significant issues due to decades of wear and tear. At this time, this home is unable to be occupied due to the overwhelming number of upgrades required for safety purposes. These upgrades are critical for the continuation of services for youth, and families, who are struggling to stay together due to severe conflict at home. Our goal is to raise \$50,000 by October to make these necessary upgrades.
