I'm not sure exactly what they said, but it must have encouraged him to give the program a chance. After that visit, not only was my son agreeable to going back but looked forward to his time

I'm 17 years old, and I've been at the shelter for almost a year. I've been in the foster care system the entire time. I've had a rough go of it, but the director and counselor here are 'my people.' I can depend on them, and they've given me the support and encouragement I needed to finish my classes and earn my high school diploma.

The Shelter Home Program served 9 boys for a total of 1,815 days through the Shelter Home Program.

The Highlands Teen Pregnancy Shelter served 9 girls and 6 babies for a total of 2,221 days.

Safe Landing Youth Shelter served 129 youth through short-term residential services for a total of 2,319 days and 96% of youth left the shelter to positive, long-term living arrangements.

Street Outreach Services served 138 young

adults, including 36 young adults through the Bridges Program and 22 young adults/families through Rapid Re-Housing Program.

The Respite Care Program served 82 duplicated youth through short-term respite care for 237 days.
